With this issue we present the third one in this current volume of the International Journal of Information Studies.

In the first paper on “**Digital Information and Provision of E-Resources and its Services in Engineering Colleges**” the authors *Krishnamurthy, Subhash Reddy and Roopa* have assessed the information needs of the generation Z, for which they resorted to the survey using 150 end-users. At the end of the analysis they found that most of the studied users are providing digital services in spite of lack of support from their management and subsequently lack of demand from the user.

Subhash Reddy and Krishnamurthy in their study on **Information Seeking Behavior of Postgraduate Engineering Students: A Study tried to** understand the information seeking pattern of postgraduate engineering students of a selected institution. This study has also observed with a strategy for searching the documents sources, user's opinion, and user satisfaction with print and e-resources.

In the last paper on “**Growth of Global Warming Publications: A Scientometric Approach**” the authors *Santha Kumar Ramiah, Kaliyaperumal and Balasubramanian* aimed at analyzing the global publication trends on global warming using Web of Science database for the period 2006-2015. Their study analysed the broad features of literature on global warming focusing on year wise growth of publications, most prolific authors, highly productive institutes, highly productive countries, language wise distributions of publications, high productive subject areas and most preferred journals for publications by scientists etc.

The papers in this issue denote the observations and survey conducted in different institutions.
