In the first paper on “**Internet Search Engine used by Faculty Members A Study with Special Reference to Arts and Science Colleges in Coimbatore- A Study**” the authors *Sivasubramanian* and *Gomathi* analyzed the use of search engines and related issues among the faculties of selected institutions using questionnaire. This work has studied the various aspects of using search engines such as, use of arts and science subject search engines, substance and preference of search engines, conduct to place the information from the Internet during search engines, and troubles faced by the users and satisfaction rank of users through using the search engines.

In the next paper on “**Exploring the Concept of “Tiers-Lieu” for Information Services: The Value of Conceptual Modeling**” the authors *Jolita Ralyté* and *Michel Léonard* proposed a new approach called Tiers-Lieu for Services (TLS) a collaborative approach enabling innovation and co-creation is necessary to develop sustainable and democratic information services. They reported on two experimental TLS conducted in the context of our continuing education program. Based on these explorations we will further study the concept of TLS and progress towards defining a method for conducting TLS.

In the last paper on “**Social Media Recruitment from Employers Perspective**” the authors *Hari G Krishna* and *Vyshak Mohan* developed search model in order to find relationships between the qualities of Social Networking Sites and effective recruitment. Authors have found that Effective recruitment is characterized by the diversity of applicants, the quality of applicants/applications, the costs, the time and the target group orientation.
