We release the last issue of the **Journal of Information Technology Review** which has the following described papers.

In the opening paper on **“Literature survey of the domain ‘Degrowth’ using publications in the domain”** the authors have used a literature survey method to analyse the publication output in the fields of degrowth pedagogy. The authors claim that this domain is concerned with the fundamental approaches posed to survive in a world of limited resources and to face the profound causes of the current crisis. In this work, the authors have analysed a small dataset of 88 papers which addressed the domain ‘degrowth’ published during the period 2006 to 2019.

In the next paper on **“Knowledge integration for interdisciplinary research and the study of methods”**, the authors have developed system for promoting interdisciplinary research capabilities and skills to develop the skill to meet challenges where the complexity is moving towards the domains.

In the last paper on **“Information technology framework for higher educational institutions”** the authors have prepared a framework and design for developing an information system that will work in higher educational institutions. The authors have identified a particular institution for case study. The authors claim that the lessons learned from our study will be very significant as it leads not only to digitize the particular institution, but can help to generalize and expand to other institutions.
